ROBINSON RANCH SERVICE LATERAL PROJECT

For approximately three weeks in the month of March, the District will be replacing residential service lines in Tract No. 11403, one of the first or original tracts in Robinson Ranch. This project has been coordinated with the City of Rancho Santa Margarita, who will be contracting for asphalt repaving of the streets in this area of the Robinson Ranch community. This project is important because following this asphalt overlay project, the City will issue a three to five year moratorium to prevent any work that would impact the asphalt overlay, with the exception of emergency repairs.

The water and wastewater infrastructure of the affected area of Robinson Ranch was originally constructed on or about 1981. The original installation of the residential service laterals was constructed using 1-inch plastic pipe instead of copper piping as specified in the District's standards. Over the course of the past 30 years, whenever there has been a leak or failure of a plastic service lateral, the District has replaced the plastic service lateral with new copper piping, per District standard specifications. To date, approximately ninety percent of the approximately 270 plastic service laterals in Tract 11403 have been replaced.

Historically, the failure of these plastic service laterals in Tract 11403 occurs on an annual basis, and in variable amounts and locations. Most recently, District Water Department staff worked to replace two failed service laterals during an emergency repair in December, 2012. Subsequently, District staff has

conducted a field survey to document the location and length of remaining plastic service laterals. At the February 20, 2013, Regular Board Meeting, the Board of Directors approved the replacement of the remaining plastic service laterals as their reliability is in question.

The customers affected by this project will receive advance notification prior to the scheduled replacement of the service lateral pipeline to their respective residence. DISTRICT FACILITY TOUR

On Thursday, February 14th, TCWD hosted a tour of the Robinson Ranch Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) for local Daisy Troop No. 2706. The primary focus of the visit was the practice of recycling on a local level, and what the Troop members could do individually to reduce, reuse and recycle. Some of the additional topics which were discussed included the protection of our natural resources and how to decrease our impact on the environment.

TCWD's Wastewater Chief Plant Operator Travis Jones demonstrated how the WWTP receives and treats one hundred percent of the sewage from residents and businesses on the upper Plano, explained the different treatment methods which are used at the WWTP to create recycled water, and ended with a brief walkthrough of the facility. 2 TCWD'S ON TAP

One of the key messages of the tour is that the WWTP takes something that nobody wants, such as raw sewage, and makes something that everybody needs: a safe alternative source of water for irrigation. This is an important message because the use of recycled water for irrigation offsets the District's purchase of imported potable water, which in turn, decreases the overall demand on our natural resources.

IRRIGATION TIMER SCHEDULES

During the winter months of January through March, there is a decreased need for the irrigation of grasses and plants. This is typically due to the winter season's characteristically increased amount of rain. Now is an excellent time to review irrigation timer schedules and adjust the duration and frequency of usage, if necessary.

It is important to remember that most of the soil in District's service area is heavily clay-based, which makes for a dense ground which can be adverse to percolation. Unchecked long irrigation run times can result in increased runoff and wasted water. The best solution to this problem is to utilize multiple start times and shorter run times to allow effective percolation and reduce unnecessary water waste.
